CARB/City of Sacramento Vice-Mayor Eric Guerra's Biography:

Eric Guerra, 44, of Sacramento, was appointed to the California Air Resources Board in January 2023 by Governor Gavin Newsom. Guerra has been Vice-Mayor for the City of Sacramento since 2023 and a Sacramento City Councilmember since 2015. He was a Consultant for the California State Senate from 2016 to 2022. Guerra earned a Master of Public Policy degree from California State University, Sacramento. Prior to his election to the City Council, Councilmember Guerra served as the Governor Appointee to the California State University Board of Trustees, President of the Tahoe Park Neighborhood Association, Chairman of the Sacramento County Planning Commission, President of the Sacramento State Alumni Association and has over 13 years of experience in the California State Legislature in numerous roles.

Councilmember Guerra is appointed to serve on behalf of the City of Sacramento on the multi-jurisdictional Joint Powers boards:

Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District; Sacramento Regional County Solid Waste Authority; Sacramento Area Sere District Board (SASD); Sacramento Metropolitan Cable Commission; Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD); Sacramento Transportation Authority (STA); Sacramento County Disaster Commission.

He also represents the City on their standing Law & Legislation Committee and the League of California Cities Board of Directors.

Councilmember Guerra is focused on improving the quality of life in our neighborhoods through protecting our parks, revitalizing Stockton Boulevard, developing the Sacramento Center of Innovation (SCI), and bringing more commerce to the Power Inn Corridor.
